



Announcement of the Immigration Office, Roi Et Province

Subject: Anti-Bribery Policy Fiscal

Year B.E. 2569 (2026)

In accordance with Section 128, paragraph one, of the Organic Act on Anti-Corruption B.E. 2561 (2018), it is prohibited for any state official to accept assets or any other benefits that may be calculated in monetary value from any person other than those to which they are legally entitled under laws, regulations, or rules issued by virtue of legal authority, except for gifts or benefits given in accordance with customary ethics and within the criteria and limits prescribed by the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC).

This also includes the Code of Conduct for Police Officers B.E. 2564 (2021), Clause 2(2), which requires honesty and integrity in performing duties in accordance with laws, regulations, and the Royal Thai Police's ethical standards, with transparency, responsibility, respect for human rights, readiness for accountability, and awareness of public interest. Clause 2(4) emphasizes prioritizing public interest over personal interest, possessing public-mindedness, cooperation, and dedication to public benefit and social well-being.

Furthermore, in accordance with the National Reform Plan on Prevention and Suppression of Corruption and Misconduct (revised edition), Key Reform Activity 4 aims to develop a transparent and corruption-free public sector. Goal 1, Item 1.1 requires all government agencies to declare a "No Gift Policy," whereby all officials shall not accept gifts or any kind of benefits arising from their duties.

Therefore, in order to prevent conflicts of interest and the receipt of bribes, gifts, or any other benefits affecting official duties, the Immigration Office of Roi Et Province hereby establishes the Anti-Bribery Policy and No Gift Policy with the following details:

Objectives

To prevent and reduce the risk of bribery and conflicts of interest among police officers under the Immigration Office of Roi Et Province.

To promote awareness among officers to refuse all types of gifts and benefits arising from official duties.

To establish an organizational culture of integrity and transparency within the public sector in a sustainable manner.

To define measures, guidelines, and mechanisms to prevent the giving or receiving of bribes or other benefits.

To establish guidelines for acceptance of hospitality or gifts by executives and officers in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

To support and enhance implementation under the National Strategy, national reform plans, and the Integrity and Transparency Assessment (ITA) framework.

Scope of Enforcement This policy applies to all police officers under the Immigration Office of Roi Et Province.

Definitions

“Bribery” refers to assets or other benefits given to a person in order to induce that person to act or refrain from acting in their official capacity, whether lawful or unlawful, as desired by the giver. This includes gifts, facilitation payments, tokens of goodwill, donations, hospitality, or similar benefits that may reasonably be considered bribery.

“Performance of duties” refers to actions carried out by government officials in their appointed or assigned roles, including general and specific duties as defined by law.

“Supervisor” refers to a person with authority to command, supervise, monitor, and inspect subordinate officers.

“Subordinate” refers to all police officers under the Immigration Office of Roi Et Province, excluding supervisors.

Disciplinary Measures for Violation

Violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action, criminal proceedings, or other legal actions. Supervisors who neglect or fail to address violations may also be subject to disciplinary penalties up to dismissal.

Lack of awareness of this policy or related laws shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.

Supervisors under Royal Thai Police Order No. 1212/2537 dated 1 October 1994 are responsible for ensuring compliance among subordinates.

Monitoring and Evaluation

The Superintendent of Immigration Office of Roi Et Province shall declare a commitment to integrity, transparency, and good governance, and disseminate it to officers and stakeholders.

Supervisors shall monitor and report violations promptly. The office shall periodically review and improve implementation guidelines as appropriate. Administrative units shall compile quarterly statistics on bribery-related issues and report to the Superintendent.

Protection of Complainants, Whistleblowers, and Witnesses

Complaints shall be treated as confidential in accordance with government confidentiality regulations. Whistleblowers and witnesses shall be protected from harm or unfair treatment.

Complainants and witnesses shall not be subjected to any adverse actions affecting their employment or livelihood. Requests for protection or remedial measures shall be considered appropriately by responsible authorities. Whistleblowers shall be protected from retaliation or unfair treatment.
